GENERAL INFORMATION

The 35th All England Artificial Ski Slope Championships will be held at Norfolk Snowsports Club, Whitlingham Lane, Trowse, Norwich on Saturday 4th and Sunday 5th September 2010.

The Championships are organised by the Snowsport England, All England Championships Race Committee.

Snowsport England would like to acknowledge and thank Norfolk Snowsports Club for their help and support in hosting the championships.

ELIGIBILITY

All Competitors in the individual events and team event must be registered racers with their Home Nation Governing Body. For all the Team Events, racers must be eligible to compete under Snowsport England/FIS rules

ENTRY CRITERIA

ALL ENGLAND CHAMPIONSHIPS (Saturday)

The championship is for Racers whose date of birth is 1999 or earlier. The relevant published BARTS list will be used to determine acceptance. This race is open to all racers with BARTS points of 250 or fewer. Within the race there is a championship for adaptive



skiers, which is open to all racers, who are registered disabled - there are no seed point requirements for this entry.

MINIS RACE (Saturday)

The Minis event is for racers born between 01.01.2000 and 31.12.2003. This event will consist of two runs down the same course, with both runs to count for the overall result. **All Minis accepted into this race MUST have a signed confirmation from their coach saying that they are capable of skiing a challenging course. Please complete the form and forward to the Race Secretary, or bring on the day, NO FORM, NO RACE**

INTER CLUB PARALLEL SLALOM TEAM EVENT (Sunday)

The team competition is open to clubs, which are registered as member clubs with Snowsport England by the Friday prior to the event (Friday 3rd September). Each club may enter one or two teams.

Clubs registered as member clubs with Snowsport Wales, Snowsport Scotland or Northern Ireland Ski Council may enter one team per club.

All team members including reserves must be in current membership of the club entering the team. Competitors may only compete for the Club named first on their registration for artificial slope racing as published on the current BARTS List.

THE ABOVE RULES WILL BE ADHERED TO STRICTLY.

OPEN TEAM EVENT (Sunday)

Each team will consist of four competitors, from **any** club registered with their HNGB, each of whom must be minimum age Children 1, at least one must be of the opposite gender to the other team members. The total number of teams accepted will be 36. The closing time for entries into this event will be 12 Noon on Saturday 4th September 2010. Should a racer wish to take part in this event but cannot make up a team please contact the Race Secretary on or before Saturday 4th September, teams for 4 can be made from these requests.

RULES

The race will be run under F.I.S. rules as varied by SSE and published in the British Artificial Competition Rules (BACR) 2009. This manual is available on <http://www.gbski.com/rules.php>. Racers and race officials should also be aware of the Guide to the Rules of Ski Racing available on <http://www.britski.org/racingguide09.pdf>

The Championships will be run under FIS Rules as modified by Snowsport GB and Snowsport England, as published in the **British Artificial Competition Rules (BACR), dated December 09**. This manual is available on <http://www.gbski.com>. Racers and race officials should also be aware of the Guide to the Rules of Ski Racing available on <http://www.britski.org/racingguide10.pdf>

Competitors are reminded of the regulations requiring the use of protective 'bungs' or caps on ski pole tips, and those governing the limits on ski/binding height. These regulations are liable to be enforced during this event.

Gloves and long sleeved garments which also cover the midriff must be worn at all times whilst on the slope, including during open practice, course inspection and the race itself.



All competitors MUST wear a properly fitted and approved safety helmet on the slope throughout the event; this includes practice session, course inspection, fore runners, and the race itself. Helmets should be compliant with standard BS EN 1077:1996 Specification for helmets for alpine skiers).

It should be noted by all competitors that the use of 'Yellow 77' lubricant is not permitted at Norfolk Snowsports Club.

ENTRIES

Individual Events

The maximum number of racers accepted into the All England Championships will be 250. The Championship Jury reserves the right to adopt a seed point cut off of fewer than 250 to maintain championship standards. Entries for the Individual Events can be made online, using the online system or posted to the Race Secretary using the official Home Nation race entry form clearly stating the category. With the exception of the overall winners, racers will only be eligible for prizes within their age category.

Online entry is available on www.britski.org Alternatively, please send your postal entry to the Race Secretary at the address below as soon as possible.

Up to 25 competitors from other Home Nations who satisfy the criteria will be accepted.

In the event of late entries being accepted the additional fee will be £10.00

Club Event

Each team will consist of four competitors, each of whom must be minimum age Children 1, at least one must be of the opposite gender to the other team members and **not more than two of whom may be Seniors or Masters**. The maximum number of teams accepted will be 36.

ALL TEAM MEMBERS MUST HAVE THE CLUB THEY ARE RACING FOR AS THEIR 1ST NAMED REGISTERED ARTIFICIAL SKI CLUB ON THE CURRENT SEED LIST

Team managers must hand in the team nominations at the end of the Team Managers Meeting on **SATURDAY MORNING**. All managers should have an up-to-date copy of rules for the Inter Club Team Event. Copies may be obtained from Snowsport England Office or from <http://www.gbski.com> and click on 'rules'

ENTRY FEES

Individual Event	£17.00 per Competitor
Club/Open Event	£35.00 per Team

The appropriate entry fee must accompany all entries. Acceptance and results will only be published on the web site.

If posting entries, a separate Cheque for each racer in the individual event is required.

CLOSING DATE FOR ALL ENTRIES

The closing date for all entries, which must be sent to the Race Secretary, is Friday 20th August 2010

PROTESTS AGAINST ACCEPTANCE / LATE ENTRIES

All protests about entries must be made in writing (emails accepted) and received by the Race Secretary by first post Wednesday 25th August 2010. Decisions on protests can be obtained by ringing the Race Secretary on Friday 27th August 2010 between 7.00pm – 8.00pm on 01508 538084

REFUNDS

Once accepted into the race, refunds will only be given to racers if a request is supported by written medical evidence.

COURSE INSPECTION

The course must be inspected wearing skis (or properly leashed snowblades), and bibs must be carried throughout course inspection so that the bib is visible on their person. No-racer is allowed to ski the course during inspection.

Only Accredited Race Trainers/Coaches will be permitted to accompany their racers on the course during inspection.

Race trainers/coaches may accompany their racers provided they are qualified and carry the relevant accreditation issued by the race office on the day or prior to the race. No other people will be allowed to enter the race area. An Accreditation Form is available for download from <http://www.britski.org/Coaches2010.pdf> This must be completed and submitted to the Race Office prior to the end of open practice on the day of the race. Approved accreditations will be available from the Race Office before course inspection.

DOPING CONTROL

Competitors should note that the Dope Control Unit may arrive unannounced at any event and will have the complete co-operation of the organisers of this race.

There have been a number of recent amendments to the Doping Control Regulations; these changes mainly affect two groups of competitors, those who suffer from asthma and taking asthma medication and those using insulin to treat insulin-dependent diabetes. The result of these new regulations is that any competitor using these drugs must obtain certification in writing from the doctor prescribing them or from the team physician. A form on which to obtain the appropriate certification is available from the SSE Head Office. This certificate must be completed in advance of competition and returned to the SSE Medical Advisor with a SAE for Acknowledgement of Notification to be returned to you.

All competitors should note that this notification is required annually.



TEAM MANAGERS MEETING

Team Managers meetings will be held throughout the Race Weekend in the Race Office, the times will be stated in Race Bulletin 2

COMMENTATOR SHEETS AND RACE BIBS

Commentator sheets must be completed and handed in when collecting a race bib. Race bibs must be returned to the Finish Marshall on completion of the third run, failure to do so will result in a charge of £25.00 for each missing bib.

REFEREE'S REPORT PROTESTS

Referee's Report protests must be made on official forms which will be available at the Race Office. These must be completed and handed in within the set time limit and accompanied by a fee of £25.00

FIRST AID & SAFETY

A Qualified Paramedic will be in attendance at the race and will be present on the slope at all times when racing is in progress. There will be a marked area for WAXING ONLY next to the race timing hut where power will be supplied. No generators are to be placed and used near the building or on the patio area.

OPEN PRACTICE

On Friday 3rd September, the bar will be open and the ski slope (with slalom poles) will be available for skiing (£7.00 fee for the 2 hour session), 7.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m.

Hot meals will be available from the Clubhouse on the Friday evening between 6.30 and 8.15pm

PHOTOGRAPHY

An accredited photographer is to be in place for the race. No other photographers will be permitted on the slope itself without prior approval by the organisers.

Racers who wish to opt out of having their photographs taken by an accredited photographer must inform the Race Secretary prior to the day of the race.

REFRESHMENTS/ENTERTAINMENT

Hot food will be available on the race days in the Club house and a Barbeque will also be provided on the patio.

Portable cookers are permitted on the grass areas of Norfolk Snowsports Club, but for health and safety reasons they are not permitted on the patio.

SKI HIRE

Please take note that for this event, skis will NOT be available for hire from Norfolk Snowsports Club.
