Option 1 – BARSC Championships – Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> December to Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> December

Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> December - First Team Captains Meeting

Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December - FIS NJR Slalom Monday 19<sup>th</sup> December - FIS NJR GS

Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> December - FIS NJR GS plus Minis GS Wednesday 21<sup>st</sup> December - Children BASS GS plus Minis GS

Thursday 22<sup>nd</sup> December - Children BASS SL

Advantages:

Accommodation would be much cheaper, probably up to 50% below the post Christmas prices. Resort would dedicate pistes for training, so when Juniors were racing Children could be training.

Resort is empty, resort/piste staff would be fully focused on the Races.

Few other FIS races, so good attendance from other nations.

Clubs could go on to further training elsewhere or return home for Christmas

Home Nations Teams might attend as they are now coming home for Christmas

Maximum 3 days out of school at end of term

Disadvantages:

Some schools will not finish until 20<sup>th</sup>/21<sup>st</sup> December, but others break up between 10<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>

Potential lack of pre race training for Juniors races, but that happens in all races anyway.

Some volunteers may not be available.

Potential lack of snow, but all pistes have artificial coverage.

Although this option lacks formal provision for a Super G, recent experience shows very few resorts can offer a SG at this time of the year and few BARSC super-Gs have been completed. The board will investigate options for running these races at a difference time of year, in a resort which is set up for speed events and/or by linking it to another GBR event.

Advantages:

Athletes have the opportunity to train before event Same programme as this year – so familiar to everyone Anglo-Scottish can be combined in one travel for children

Later in the season, so snow might be better

Disadvantages:

Price of accommodation in resort

Very busy time of year for the resort, so staff stretched

Athletes may have to miss beginning of school term, up to 4 days Potential problems getting race team there before New Year

Limited dedicated training pistes
